Events & Activities	Schedule	Detail
Orientation for incoming international students  > campus tour  > welcome party	Twice a year: early Apr. & early Oct.	Explaining life and study at TMU to new international students
Scholarship orientation for privately financed international students	New students; twice a year (early Apr. & late Sept, or early Oct.) Current students; 3 times a year (mid-Feb. and mid-Mar., and late Sept. or early Oct.)	Explaining to privately financed international students this University's pre-registration system for scholarship applications, recommendation for scholarships, and scholarship foundations. Pre-registration is usually required once a year, depending on the time of advancement to a senior class. Be sure to attend, or you will miss the opportunity to apply for and get scholarships.
International student seminar  > one-day trip  > two-days trip	Oneday trip; twice a year (late April, late Oct) two-days trip; twice a year (late Jun, late Nov)	Trips to the Kanto area for international students for the purpose of deepening friendship among them and learning about Japan's places of interest. This seminar is also open to TMU Japanese students.
Cross Cultural Understanding Seminar	Twice a year: mid-Apr. & mid-Oct.	This seminar provides information about how to spend every day of your student life comfortably and safely in Japan. The seminar also welcomes students' spouses and children.
TMU Campus Festival	Once a year: early Nov.	Every year during the campus festival international students take the initiative to set up food stands, which gain much popularity. International students are encouraged to get involved in the festival and familiarize with Japanese students. The campus festival helps make student life a lot more fruitful.  Notes: To set up a food stand in the festival, students are required to attend the "University Festival Participation Meetings" in order to register their participation. Those failing to attend the meetings will be disqualified from opening a food stand. The information on the festival meeting dates will be posted on the standing sign boards around May. Make sure not to miss it!

International Party	Once a year: early Dec.	A student group, "International Exchange Volunteer Group HANDS" hosts an international party since 2011 in collaboration with the International Affairs Office. At the party international students introduce their cultures, namely, how their people spend the year-end and new-year holidays.
Career guidance for international students seeking a job in Japan	Twice a year:  1st semester and 2nd semester; dates not yet determined	The Career Guidance is held to provide international students with information on the environment of employment and instructions on how to write job applications and how to prepare for interviews.
