

What is "Status of Residence"?


A lawful status for a foreign national in order to work in Japan, attend schools, or make an ordinary living. It is a necessary lawful status in order to stay in Japan and conduct SPECIFIC ACTIVITIES.



STUDENT

Activities to receive education at a university.

Application for Extending of Period of Stay



- •The university will issue 2 pages of an application form.
- Application can be made 3 months prior the expiration date.

Period of your residence will be expired on this date!!



The Certificate of Authorized Employment

You are allowed to work up to 28 hours a week. When the school is "officially" not in session,

8 hours a day, 40 hours a week



Notification concerning the organization to which the applicant belongs

If you belonged to another school with **student** visa until the end of March and your period of stay is valid after April...

Must report within 14 days.

Notification of transfer of affiliation to the Immigration Services Agency through the 'Notification of Affiliation (Activity) Institution' form.

Three methods are available.

- 1. Online
- 2. At the immigration office counter
- 3. By post

We would like to make sure your status of resident is appropriate.

We need to confirm your certificates when....

- you are newly enrolled.
- there are any changes.





Confirmation of Certificates on website



This is required procedures for all new international students by 4th April.

My Number (Individual Number)



- Social security and tax number (so called My number) is issued to all foreign nationals who are allowed entry with a mid-to-long term resident status.
- After receiving your notification card with a "my number", keep it safe.

National Health Insurance

- Those who are issued a Resident Card are required to obtain National Health Insurance (Kokumin-kenko-hoken): international students and researchers are not exceptions.
 This insurance not only covers 70% of your medical fees but is required for extension of your visa. You can register for the insurance policy at your local ward/city office.
- You need to present your National Health Insurance holder's (hokensho) card each time you visit any medical institution: you will then pay only 30% of the total medical costs.



National Pension

The National Pension is a public pension system that provides pension benefits to an insured person when he/she reaches a pension age. Regardless of nationality, all registered residents of Japan aged 20 to 59 years are obliged to enroll in the National Pension System.

The Special Payment System for Students

This allows the applicant to postpone payment of premiums until he/she completes his/her education, finds a job, and is able to pay (degree students only).
