About TMU Campuses

TMU has three large campuses, all of the campuses are located in Tokyo, the host city for the Olympic and Paralympic Games in 2020.

As our main campus is located in the western suburban area of Tokyo and easily accessed by direct bus from the airport (40 minutes by train from the center of Tokyo); students can enjoy both the nearness to Tokyo Metropolis which offers many academic and social activities, and lush greenery surrounded by the great nature. Thus, TMU provides a best and a most pleasant study environment for international students.

Symbol Tower of TMU

At the Minami-Osawa Campus main gate is the Symbol Tower of TMU. At both sides of the main gate, you can see cherry blossoms in full bloom every spring. On the campus you can fully enjoy four seasons of Japan around you.



Main Library

The main library is a structure of 3 floors above ground and 2 underground. Of course, a library is a good place for self-study, but this main library also contains group presentation rooms and communication spaces, where students can practice presentations and hold meetings for group projects.



International House

International House offers rooms for Japanese language classes and counselling services for international students. These rooms are efficiently used by many international students. In International House is a French restaurant, which is bustling with the university community members and people in the local community at lunch time.



Exchange Programs

Tokyo Metropolitan University has signed student exchange agreements with overseas universities and research institutions, and hosts incoming students through the student exchange program. The exchange program allows students to study at TMU for six months or one year, starting in either April or October.

TMU also has a short-term study abroad program known as Semester Abroad at Tokyo Metropolitan University (SATOMU), in which students primarily take courses taught in English. In this program, students will take international exchange courses and receive a certificate of completion if they meet the requirements.

We accepted 61 international students from 17 countries and regions in 2017.



Summer / Winter Programs

TMU offers students from universities on student exchange agreements a three- to four-week intensive Japanese-language and culture program twice a year.

The program aims at providing a comprehensive introduction to Japanese language and culture. Students will develop their language skills, experience traditional and pop culture of Japan, and increase their understanding of Japanese society.

We accepted 57 international students from 11 countries and regions in 2017 in the summer and the winter program.

We have many international students enrolled in the undergraduate and graduate schools, and the number is increasing year by year. TMU can offer many programs -- short-term, one -semester, two-semester.

International Student House

In International Student House, international students stay with a resident assistant student (Japanese) and sharing life with other residents. The House is intended to be an educational place where residents can get involved with each other every day and learn not only languages but also different values through the shared residence life. Its purpose is to help foster internationally oriented human resources and Internationalize the community and the university.

The House offers private rooms to each resident, and a shower, restroom and kitchen shared by three residents. The House has more common spaces including larger kitchens and theater room. We are sure you can make good friends at International Student House.



Annual Meeting of the Tokyo Human Resources Fund for City Diplomacy
