# Let's explore the world of Japanese pop culture!

Tokyo Metropolitan University (TMU) offers a 3-week Japanese summer course in 2018. The program aims at providing a comprehensive introduction to Japanese language and culture.

Students will develop their language skills, experience both traditional and pop culture in Japan, and increase their understanding of the Japanese society.

# **Program Contents**

The 3-week program consists of 51 hours of Japanese language class including project work, 6 hours of Japan Studies\*, and 12 hours of field trips\*. Students will be evaluated according to class participation, project work, presentation and quizzes. A certificate will be issued upon completion of the program.

\* Language of instruction: Japanese

# Japanese Language

Using the textbook 『ポップカルチャー New & Old ポップカルチャーで学ぶ初中級日本 語』, students will learn and brush up on their Japanese through the themes of pop culture in Japan, such as Anime, Manga, J-pop music, etc. There will also be project work, and students will create their original content (e.g. Mascot characters, music video and so on) in groups and give presentations.

>Number of classes: Three (12 students each)

- Japanese Level: Intermediate level (JLPT N<sub>3</sub>, or J-CAT score around 150-250)

- Japan Studies + Field Trips

Lectures about a variety of aspects of Japanese pop culture will be held by specialists in the fields. Students will also learn further about the themes through field trips.

Visited places in the field trips in Winter 2018:

- Edo-Tokyo Open Air Architectural Museum,
- Ghibli Museum, and Tachikawa Manga Park

# **Program Length**

#### Program Fee

105,000 – JPY (incl. accommodation fee)

Not included in the program fee are meals, airfare, traveler's insurance, transportation between the University and accommodation, and daily expenses. Program fee should be paid by overseas remittance <u>no later than May 18</u>. Details regarding the payment method will be sent after your application is accepted.

### **Cancellation Policy**

Please be advised that once your application has been accepted and you have paid the fee, the following cancellation policy will apply:

Maximum 50% of the program fee will be forfeited in case of cancellation on and before June 10.

Maximum 100% of the program fee will be forfeited in case of cancellation on and after June 11.

The cancellation policy applies for any reasons. Any handling or service fees incurred for refunding the fee will be borne by the applicant. It will take two to three months to reimburse the program fee.

#### **Notes**

- Admission could be competitive and not all applicants are admitted due to the limited capacity of the program.
- The program schedule may be subject to change.

- Participants in the program are required to purchase traveler's insurance to cover medical costs incurred during the period of the stay in Japan at their own expense. Please submit the copy of insurance certificate before arrival.
- The university is not responsible for delays, cancellations or any issues related to the program for reasons of force majeure or for reasons beyond its control such as but not limited to inclement weather, natural disasters, labor disputes, national emergencies, or other force majeure or circumstances beyond the university's control.
- Students must earn a minimum scores to receive a certificate of completion. Students who do not meet all the requirements will receive a certificate of participation, which is not equivalent to a certificate of completion.
