Winter Program "Japanese Foodways-Past, Present, Future"

January 16 to February 2, 2024

Tokyo Metropolitan University's (TMU) Winter Program is a unique opportunity for students from TMU's partner institutes to experience Japanese language and culture firsthand. This 3-week intensive program offers a variety of activities to help participants learn Japanese and deepen their understanding of Japanese culture.

Venue: Tokyo Metropolitan University Minami-Osawa Campus

Duration: January 16(Tue.)-February 2 (Fri.), 2024

Eligibility: Undergraduate or graduate students from our partner universities, and those who can <u>fully attend the program.</u> Admission could be competitive and not all applicants are admitted due to the limited capacity of the program.

Number of class hours: Japanese (45 hours), Japanese studies lecture (6 hours), workshop (6 hours) & field study (7.5 hours)

♦ Learn Japanese from expert instructors: Our intensive Japanese language classes*1 are designed to help you improve your skills in all four areas: speaking, listening, reading, and writing at 2 levels: CEFR B1 and B2.

SPOT 90 scores and CEFR levels The learner's level is determined by "SPOT 90".

- 45-60: Pre-intermediate Japanese (CEFR B1) = being able to communicate in everyday situations.
- 61-75: Intermediate Japanese (CEFR B2) = being able to communicate effectively in a wider range of situations, including more complex topics
- ♦ Discover Japanese culture through lectures and workshops: Leading experts and practitioners cover a variety of food-related topics, such as globalization of Japanese foods, social reponses to poverty, history of Japanese foods, and foodtec.
- ♦ Immerse yourself in Japanese culture through field study: Site visits include a local NPO, museums and shops in Tokyo to experience Japanese culture firsthand.

All activities will be conducted in English. Students will be evaluated based on their class participation, in-class activities, and a presentation. Upon completion of the program, participants will receive a certificate.*2

Program Fee: 125,000 JPY *3 The program fee covers accommodation during the program*4, textbooks, admission fees for field trips, and workshop fees only. Tuition fee is waived according to the exchange agreement.

- 5. A copy of the photo page of your passport, which must be valid for at least 6 months after the end of the program.
- 6. ID Photo (PDF data up to 500KB)

How to pay the program fee: The program fee should be paid by overseas remittance no later than the end of November. More details will be sent after your application is accepted.

Cancellation Policy: Once your application has been accepted and you have paid the program fee, the following cancellation policy will apply: Cancellation on or before December 14: 50% of the program fee will be forfeited; cancellation on or after December 15: 100% of the program fee will be forfeited.
