In addition, meaningful activities will help students learn and then use new vocabulary for deeper understanding and more dynamic writing.

This will be done via lectures, discussions, and task-based projects.</p> <p>Furthermore, this class will use three essential essay types as guides for all projects and activities. Once one essay type has been sufficiently worked through (brainstorming to completion), we will begin on the next type. The three essay types are as follows:</p> <p>Expository Essay: Clearly explain a topic or concept  Argumentative Essay: Develop and defend a position on an issue</p> <p>Compare and Contrast Essay: Analyze similarities and differences between subjects.</p>					
授業外学習	Students will write three essays meant to show off skills they are currently mastering. They will do this by following a step-by-step plan, from brainstorming and outlining to rough and final drafts, that simultaneously gives them freedom to try new mechanisms of written English while also teaching them how to stay organized through the process. This will be done both in and out of class through a wide variety of activities. Each essay will be submitted in a portfolio that shows the process from start to finish and will be graded not just on precision, but also effort and growth.
