1. Course Levels

(1) Course Levels at TMU

TMU Japanese Language Course has six levels based on the CEFR¹.

Level / Learning Goal	Overview
CEFR A1 Starter Level	This course is intended for total beginners learning Japanese for the first time. Students will acquire simple expressions and phrases for everyday use and will be able to engage in basic conversations, including self-introductions and shopping.
CEFR A2 (A2.1/A2.2) Elementary Level	To be able to understand simple expressions and phrases used in daily life, to read simple texts, and to write simple letters. Level A2.2 is higher than A2.1.
CEFR B1 Intermediate Level	To be able to understand expressions and phrases used in daily life, to hold simple conversations and discussions, to read simple documents, and to write their own comments.
CEFR B2 Upper-intermediate Level	To be able to engage in complex conversations and discussions, to read texts from newspapers and magazines, and to write one's own opinions.
CEFR C1 Advanced Level	To be able to engage in professional conversations and discussions, to read complex texts in newspapers and magazines, and to write down one's own opinions in detail.
CEFR C2 Super-advanced Level	To be able to use the same level of sophisticated Japanese as native Japanese university students. Currently C2 class is not offered.

2. Japanese Language Courses at TMU

TMU offers three types of Japanese language courses: (1) Practical Japanese; (2) Online Japanese: Living and Working in Japan; and (3) Common Language Subject. Each has its own properties and different rules regarding credits.

(1) Practical Japanese

Eligibility: Exchange students

Level: A1, A2.1, A2.2, B1, B2, C1

Method: Onsite/in-person (Minami-osawa Campus)

Credits: Only exchange students can earn credits. Official course registration procedures are required.

- ※ Graduate and research students may attend this course, but no credit will be awarded. Please inform the instructor of your intention to participate in the class.
- ※ There are two types of classes in Starter (A1) and Elementary (A2.1 & A2.2) courses: *Katsudo: Language Activity* and *Rikai: Language Competence*. It is recommended to participate in both for a thorough study. The differences between *Katsudo* and *Rikai* are as follows.

<i>Katsudo: Language Activity</i>	<i>Rikai: Language Competence</i>
<ul style="list-style-type: none">- For students who want to start using Japanese immediately.- The objective is <i>to gain practical ability communicating in everyday situations</i>.- Students will practice listening to and speaking Japanese a lot.	<ul style="list-style-type: none">- For students who want to learn about Japanese.- The objective is <i>to study the features of Japanese language</i> that are necessary for communication.- Students will systematically study how Japanese is used in communication.

(2) Online Japanese: Japanese for Living and Working in Japan

Eligibility: All students

Level: A1, A2.1, A2.2, B1

Method: Online (Zoom)

Credits: No students will earn any credit.

- ※ This is a once-a-week course designed to make it easier for busy students to study Japanese. It is free of charge. Students can review and practice what you have studied in class through the apps and website linked to the textbook. You can do it at your own pace,

so it's easy to keep studying Japanese. Since the courses are online, it is easy for students who belong to Hino or Arakawa Campus to join the class. If you want to participate, please apply using the application form:

(3) Common Language Subject (Japanese I & II)

Eligibility: Undergraduate students

Level: JLPT (Japanese Language Proficiency Test) N1

Method: Onsite/in-person (Minami-osawa Campus)

Credits: Only undergraduate students can earn credits. Official course registration procedures are required.

※ Some courses are open for exchange, graduate, and research students. Please ask the class instructor if you can attend the class and if you will receive credit.

1. レベル

(1) 日本語クラスのレベル

TMU の日本語クラスには、CEFR²の考え方に基づいて、6つのレベルがあります。

到達目標レベル	クラス内容
CEFR A1 初級レベル	初めて日本語を勉強する初学者のためのクラス。日常生活で使われる簡単な表現やフレーズを理解し、自己紹介やショッピングなどの基本的な会話ができるようになる。
CEFR A2 (A2.1/A2.2) 基礎レベル	日常生活で使われる簡単な表現やフレーズを理解し、簡単な文書を読んだり、簡単な手紙を書いたりすることができるようになる。A2.2の方がA2.1よりレベルが高い。
CEFR B1 中級レベル	日常生活で使われる表現やフレーズを理解し、簡単な会話や議論ができるようになる。簡単な文章を読んだり、自分の意見を書いたりすることができるようになる。
CEFR B2 中上級レベル	日常生活で使われる表現やフレーズを理解し、複雑な会話や議論ができるようになる。新聞や雑誌などの文章を読んだり、自分の意見を書いたりすることができる。
CEFR C1 上級レベル	日常生活で使われる表現やフレーズを理解し、専門的な会話や議論ができるようになる。新聞や雑誌などの複雑な文章を読んだり、自分の意見を詳しく書いたりすることができる。
CEFR C2 超上級レベル	日本語ネイティブの大学生と同じレベルの高度な日本語を使うことができるようになる。現在、C2クラスは開講なし。

2. TMUの日本語コース

(1) 実践日本語

主な対象: 交換留学生

レベル: A1, A2.1, A2.2, B1, B2, C1

実施方法: 対面 (南大沢キャンパス)

単 位: 交換留学生だけが単位をもらえます。単位をもらうためには、公式な科目登録の手続きが必要です。

※ 大学院生と研究生ももちろん参加できます。でも、単位をもらうことはできません。クラスに参加したいときは、教室に行って、先生にクラスに参加したいと伝えてください。

※ 入門 (A1) レベルと初級 (A2.1 & A2.2) レベルには、「かつどう」と「りかい」の2つがあります。両方に参加する方がしっかり勉強できておすすめです。でも、どちらか1つだけでもいいです。「かつどう」と「りかい」の違いは、つぎのとおりです。

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Teaching methods	Lessons are based on the textbook. Students will learn basic grammar in conversation. Students are expected to learn hiragana and katakana by week 5. Classes will be conducted almost entirely in Japanese, using textbooks. Before class, please read the "Table of Contents" on page 18 of the textbook to see what you will be learning in class. It is important to practise letters and words not only in class but also on your own. Although the textbook covers romaji, it is recommended that you are able to																																																																																																			

	read hiragana and katakana. Students will also speak in key phrases using words and expressions related to the content of each lesson. After studying two lessons, students will have time to independently reflect on what they have learned and use expressions learned in class outside of the classroom.
Homework/assignments	Students must prepare for the topics of a lesson assigned by the instructor before the class and review the lesson after the class. Students must learn new words of each lesson.

Teaching methods	Classes will be taught in English and Japanese, using a textbook. Please look at the "BENKYO-SURUMAENI(「べんきょうするまえに」)" at the beginning of each lesson from Topic2 and think about what you will learn in class. It is important to practice letters and words not only in class but also by self-study. At first, there will be romaji, but from Topic 6 of the text, the number of places where romaji will be attached will be limited. Hiragana and Katakana should be mastered by Topic 5. Grammar will be studied through conversation and practiced based on an understanding of sentence patterns and rules. Students will also practice reading and writing short sentences related to the content of this lesson. At the end of each lesson, students will be given time to independently reflect on what they have learned and to use the expressions learned in class outside the classroom.
